Today we mourn the passing of a beloved old friend,
Mr. Common Sense.

Mr. Sense had been with us for many years.
He will be remembered as having cultivated such valuable lessons as knowing when to come in out of the rain why the early bird gets the worm and that life isn't always fair.

Common Sense lived by simple, sound financial policies (don't spend more than you earn) and reliable parenting strategies (adults, not kids, are in charge).

His health began to rapidly deteriorate when schools were required to get parental consent to administer aspirin to a student, but could not inform the parents when a student became pregnant and wanted to have an abortion.

Finally, **Common Sense** lost the will to live as the Ten Commandments became contraband;

Churches became businesses; and criminals received better treatment than their victims.

Common Sense was preceded in death by his parents, **Truth** and **Trust**, his wife, **Discretion**, his daughter, **Responsibility**, and his son **Reason**.

Two stepbrothers, **My Rights** and **Ima Whiner**, survive him.

Not many attended his funeral because so few realised he was gone.
