He didn't surround himself with politicians, soldiers or bankers.
He did sit and eat with people who were usually despised, ignored and rejected.
He reached out to embrace those others saw as worthless and as sinners.
He didn't live in a castle surrounded by maids or servants.
He did spend his time with the poor, the sick, the broken and all those who were in need of love, healing and compassion.
He didn't own anything.

He didn't have any riches or wealth that the world thought much of; but he did share his greatest possession with us
